

## Company A, 120<sup>th</sup> OVI

BUDD, Andrew 25 Aug 1862

Private Budd was 34 when he entered service. He was transferred to Co. H 114th OVI on 27 Nov 1864. Transferred to Co F, 48th OVI, 24 July 1865. Mustered out 14 Oct 1865.

Father: William BUDD

Mother: Jane HASSON

Birth: 4 Apr 1828, Paint Twp, Wayne Co OH, or 7 Apr 1828

Marriage: Jane HENNING, Oct 1853

Death: 22 Dec 1905

Cemetery: West Lebanon Lutheran Cemetery, Paint Twp, Wayne Co OH

Pension card: Andrew BUDD was in Co A 120th OH, F 48th OH and H 114th OH. He applied for an invalid pension on 28 Mar 1892, Application 1101592, Certificate 923492, filed in OH. Card says he died 1906 but that is wrong.

Was Andrew's first name actually William or did Andrew have a twin named William?

1850 Census Paint Twp, Wayne County OH, page 44: Wm BUDD Sr, age 55 PA, farmer; Jane, age 40 PA; Wm Jr. age 20 OH, farmer; Joshua, age 18 OH, farmer; Israel, age 14 OH; Joseph, age 12 OH; John age 10 OH; Ira, age 4 OH; Catharine, age 1 OH. [Andrew did have a brother named Joshua.]

Andrew married Jane HENNING in 1853.

1860 Census, just can't find Andrew and family.

1870 Census, West Lebanon, Paint Twp, Wayne County, OH, page 281: Jane BUDD, age 60 OH; Elisabeth, age 21 OH; Andrew BUD, age 40 OH, farm hand; Johanna, age 35 OH; Elisabeth, age 14 OH; Hester, age 12 OH; and Elva, age 1 OH.

1880 Census West Lebanon, Paint Twp, Wayne county, OH, page 265: Andrew BUDD, age 50 OH, farmer, parents born PA; Jane, wife, age 42 OH, no birthplace for parents; Stella E, daughter, age 21 OH; Elva, son, age 11 OH; Leah, daughter, age 9 OH; Jane BUDD, mother, age 69 PA, parents born PA; Esseneth E BUDD, sister, age 30 OH, parents born PA.

Not on 1890 Veterans Schedule.

1900 Census, Paint Twp, Wayne County OH, page 26: Andrew BUDD, age 72 OH, born Apr 1828, widowed, parents born PA, day laborer; Asenath BUDD, daughter, age 42 OH, born June 1857, single; Bertie BUDD, grandson, age 10, born Nov 1889 [parents born OH].

Andrew Budd was a member of Company A, 120th Ohio Volunteer Infantry, from his enlistment at Wooster, August 25, 1862, until he was discharged, after three years and two months service, at Houston, Texas, October 14, 1865. During that time he saw varied service, participating in all the battles, skirmishes, and marches of the regiment, all its service except the part performed in the siege of Vicksburg. At that time he was detailed to serve on the hospital boat "Nashville," running on the Mississippi. He was with the boat about six months, rejoining his regiment at Plaquemine, and sharing with it in the Red River expedition, when he was on the City Belle when she was fired into, but was able to make his escape, climbing the bank under heavy fire, and marching all the way to Alexandria without pause. The battles in which he participated previous to his detail were Chickasaw Bayou, Arkansas Post, Black River Bridge, Raymond and Jackson, and he was participant in the siege of Mobile, and the gallant storming of Fort Blakeley, the last battle of the war.

Joshua Budd, his brother, was a member of Co. G, 107th Ohio Volunteers, and died in hospital at Charleston, S.C., of yellow fever, in the fall of 1865. William and Samuel Budd, relatives of Andrew, were in the regiment with him, and both died in hospital in 1863. [[See Company C for Samuel and William.](#)] Andrew Budd is the son of William and Jane (Hasson) Budd, and was born in Paint township, Wayne county, April 4, 1828. In Wilmot, Stark county, Ohio, October, 1853, he married Jane, daughter of Daniel and Elizabeth (Deardorf) Henning. She was born in Paint township, June 11, 1833. Their children were born: Mary Jane, Sept, 1854, died 1859; Asenath Elizabeth, June 28, 1856, lives in Orrville, this county; Estella Esther, April 22, 1859; Elva E., June 8, 1869; Nancy (Nacy ?) Leah, December 30, 1870; these three with their parents. Mr. Budd is a farmer and stock-raiser; residence, in West Lebanon, which is his postoffice address. [*West Lebanon is at the northern border of Paint township in Wayne county OH. It is southeast of Kidron.*]

OBITUARY---ANDREW BUDD

Andrew Budd, son of William and Jane (Hasson) Budd, was born near West Lebanon on the 7th day of April, 1828. Died Dec. 22, 1905, aged 77 years 8 months and 18 days. In October 1853 he was married to Miss Jane Henning. To this union there were five children born, three of whom are still living. There are also seven grand children. His wife died nineteen years ago. He was the second son of a family of ten children, eight sons and two daughters, of whom, four brothers and one sister are still living.

He was a member of Co. A, 120th O.V.I. He enlisted in Wooster, Ohio, on the 2d day of August, 1862, and was discharged at Houston, Texas, on the 14th day of October, 1865, having served three years and two months. During that time he saw varied service, participating in all the skirmishes, battles and marches of the regiment in all its services except that part which it performed in the siege of Vicksburg. At that time he was detailed to serve on the hospital boat "Nashville" running on the Mississippi river. He was with the boat about six months and then rejoined his regiment at Plaquemine [*Louisiana*], and sharing with it in the Red River Expedition. He was on the "City Belle" when it was fired into but made his escape by swimming the river and climbing the bank under heavy fire and marched all the way to Alexandria without pause. The battles in which he was engaged were Chickasaw Bayou, Arkansas Post, Black River Bridge, Raymond and Jackson. He also participated in the siege of Mobile and the storming of Fort Blakley, the last battle of the war. In civil life he was a farmer, a straight forward honest man, a worthy citizen, a kind husband and an indulgent father.

Wayne County Grave Registration Card: Andrew BUDD, born 1828, died 22 Dec 1905, is buried in West Lebanon Lutheran Cemetery in Paint Twp, Wayne County OH.

Family Search, Death record in Ohio: Brother, Ira BUDD died 12 Aug 1929 in Massilon, Stark Co OH. He was born 25 Jan 1846 in Stark Co OH. His father was William BUDD, born Westmoreland Co PA. His mother was Jane HASSEN, born PA.

Family Search, Death record in Ohio: Son, Elva Ezra BUDD died 4 Mar 1945 in Paint Twp, Wayne County, OH. Born 8 June 1869 in West Lebanon, Paint Twp, Wayne Co OH. His parents were Andrew BUDD and Jane HENNING.
