Lucius Cranmore CARR

Private Carr was 30 when he entered service. He was promoted to 2d Lieutenant 11 July 1863, but not mustered; discharged 25 Feb 1864 at Plaquemine, Louisiana.

Orrville Courier-Crescent, 20 Apr 1915, page 1: Successful Farmer and Respected Citizen Died on Friday.

"Lucius Cranmore Carr, a native of Wayne county, who spent his entire life in the county and was one of the well known residents, died at the family home in Bloomington Friday morning at 4 o'clock from the infirmities of old age. Mr. Carr was about 83 years old.

His passing away was in a gentle sleep and he was conscious up to the last. Only a moment or two before he passed away he was asked by R. E. Frase, son-in-law, who was caring for him last night, if he was warm enough and Mr. Carr replied that he was very comfortable. After making the reply Mr. Carr turned over in bed and within a very short time his spirit had taken flight to that realm beyond the river of life, where suffering and pain are not known.

Mr. Carr was born in East Union township, March 17, 1831, and was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Rodney Carr. His early life was spent on a farm in that township. About a quarter of a century ago he moved with his family to Wooster. In recent years he

built a beautiful home in Bloomington.

Mr. Carr was a very successful farmer along scientific lines. He was the owner of a number of farms which he bought and improved them by scientific culture.

He saw considerable service in the Civil War, being a member of company A. 120th O. V. I., which was formed in this county.

The deceased is survived by his wife, to whom he was married June 14, 1864; three daughters, Mrs. R. E. Frase, Miss Lenora Carr and Miss Grace Carr, a teacher, of this city; and a son, Ralph H. Carr, professor of agriculture in Purdue University. The latter arrived in Wooster Wednesday. Two grandchildren and one great-grandchild also survive.

The funeral services were held from the late home Sunday afternoon at 2:30, conducted by Dr. D. A. Heron of the First Presbyterian church."

Bloomington was located in the area where Burbank Rd and Cleveland Rd met...the area just north of that.

Orrville Crescent, 23 Apr 1915, p 3:

"The funeral services of Lucian Carr were held from the Bloomington Home Sunday afternoon, D. D. A. Heron, officiating. Out of town relatives and friends in attendance were Mrs. D. H. McMillan, Mr. and Mrs. O. D. Braden, Mrs. S. Reidel of Orrville; Mr. and Mrs. W. D. Miller, Akron; Dr. and Mrs. C. B. Carr, Barberton; Mrs. Sarah Carr, Kenmore; Mr. and Mrs. W. A. Winkler, Canal Dover; Mrs. L. A. Sell, Glenn Sell, Sterling; Mr. and Mrs. Alvin Maurer, Mr. and Mrs. J. W. Amstutz, Mrs. Harvey Weir, Mrs. Della Dodez, Applecreek; W. H. Wertz, Dalton. The pallbearers were R. J. Smith, M. S. Reed, W. E. Feeman, M. Rouch, J. W. Christy and J. B. Taylor."

Lucius C CARR married Sarah L BROWN on 21 June 1864 in Wayne County OH. [Record at Family Search]

Lucius C. Carr died in Wayne County Ohio on 16 Apr 1915.

Daughter Lenora Lawhead CARR, was a high school teacher. She died in 1940. She and her sister, Grace, were still living in Bloomington/Wooster in 1940 at 1690 Cleveland Rd.
