Private John Baughman, was 23 when he entered service.
He was captured 3 May 1864, near Snaggy Point on Red
River Louisiana.; mustered out 19 June 1865 at Camp
Chase, OH.

Paul Sydney BAUGHMAN, the older brother of George Franklin and John Wyant BAUGHMAN, served in
McLaughlin's Squadron during the Civil War and kept up a pretty steady correspondence with his parents
during much of his service. About 1993 more than thirty of his letters were transcribed and compiled under
the title "*Well and Hearty at this Time...*" Several of letters mention John, including the following:

"Sept 9th./62...Frank's letter stated that Jno had the ague. That will not be a very agreeable thing to have
in a military camp...."

"April 4th./63...I was well pleased by learning the Family was all well except John. I wish John may get a
discharge. If he has ague every other day it will be hard for him in camp, for there he cannot take proper
care of himself...."

"July 22nd, AD 1864...Was happy to hear of the continued good health of the family entire except Jno. I
would like very well to know of John's certain fate. I hope it is not as bad as supposed...."

[Since we do not have the letters written to Paul, we can only speculate as to what prompted his concern in
the letter of 22 July. But, given the time it took for news to travel, it is very possible that Paul had just
learned that John was missing. Though Paul was not mustered out until Jan 1865, the 22 Jul 1864 letter is
apparently the last one he wrote to his parents--or, at least, the last to survive. Contributed by Kerry

John W. Baughman "He was born in Monroe township, Richland county, Ohio, in 1838. He is son of Aaron and Katharine (Schrack) Baughman..."

p. 1144 "...On August 12, 1862, he enlisted for three years in Company V, One Hundred and twentieth Ohio Volunteer Infantry, and was mustered out of the service June 19, 1865, at Camp Chase, Ohio, by order of the war department."

"The Red river is the southernmost of the larger affluents of the Mississippi, and is formed by several forks, rising in the canyons of the desert called El Llano Estacado, in northwestern Texas.... One cause of the failure of the Red river expedition was the low stage of water at the time. On the 3d of May, 1864, while on this Red river expedition Mr. Baughman was taken prisoner near Snaggy Point. He was taken to Camp Ford prison, in Smith county, Texas, where he was kept a prisoner for over thirteen months."

"Two years after Mr. Baughman's return from the army he was married in 1867 to Miss Mary E. Mowry, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel Mowry, and to that union eight children have been born, one of whom died in infancy."
