Private David Williams was 62 when he entered service. He was discharged 10 Feb. 1863 at Cairo, Illinois on a Surgeon's certificate of disability.

1870 Census, Lexington, Troy Twp, Richland County, OH, page 350: David WILLIAMS, age 69 PA, cattle broker; Rachel, age 68 PA; Mary, age 45 PA; David, age 39 PA; George, age 34 PA, cattle broker; Sarah, age 32 PA.

In 1880 Rachel is still living in Lexington OH [page 138] with children David, Mary and George.

He was born in Franklin Co., Pa., in the year of 1831, being 73 years, 9 months, 4 days of age. He leaves the following brothers and sisters: John and Mary Williams, Mrs. Sarah George, of this place, Samuel Williams, of Akron, and Mrs. Rebecca Shafer, of Bellville. The services were conducted by the Rev. J.C. Dole, of the Congregational church, of which he was a life long member, assisted by Rev. O.L. Cook and Rev. H.F.
