John T CLARK
Private Clark was age 18 when he entered service. He was captured 3 May 1864 near Snaggy Point on the Red River, Louisiana; mustered out 7 July 1865 at Camp Chase, Ohio.

John Clark Died Today at Home Near Wooster

John Clark, 78, civil war veteran, living on the Wooster-Apple creek road, died suddenly of heart trouble Wednesday morning at 7:30 o'clock. Mr. Clark became ill after finishing his chores and lay down on his bed in his working clothes, hoping to get better. His grandson, Lester Davidson, with whom he lived, called a physician, but death claimed the aged man before help came. Two sons and two daughters survive.

Obituary

John T. Clark was born May 25th 1844 and departed this life April 5, 1922 at the age of 77 years, 10 months and ten days.

He was one of a family of four, two brothers and one sister having preceded him to the better world. At the age of seventeen years he enlisted in the 120th O.V.I., in which capacity he served until the close of the war in 1865. He was united in marriage to Miss Ollvan [see name above] Crummel September 7, 1865. To this union were born five girls and two boys, one daughter dying in infancy, two daughters, Mrs. Frank Billard, and Mrs. John Darr of Wooster have died in recent years. The mother and wife preceded him in death some four and one half years ago. Mr. Clark is survived by two sons and two daughters, Mrs. Frank Read of West Salem, Mrs. T.J. Troutman of Orrville; Mr. Lewis Clark and Mr. Perry Clark of Applecreek and the following grand children: Mr. Charles Read and Mr. Lewis Read of West Salem and Mr. Fred Read of Wooster, Miss Lila Davidson of Massillon, Miss Hazel Davidson of Canal Fulton, Mrs. Ralph Musselman of Wooster, Mr. Lester Davidson, of Applecreek, Miss Maxine Billard of Wooster, Misses Fay and Betla {?}Darr of Wooster and Richard Thomas Clark and Lela May Clark of Applecreek, and one great grand son Kenneth Neal Musselman of Wooster. Mr. Clark took and cared for the one grand son, Lester, since he was six years old.

Mr. Clark was one of the early members of the M.E. church of which he was a faithful attendant as long as his health would permit. He was a kind and loving father and a man who had the respect of all who knew him.

Having been in fairly good health, his sudden departure was quite a shock to the community.
