HANNA, James R. 25 Feb 1864 James R. HANNAH
Private Hanna was age 22 when he entered service. He was captured 3 May 1864 near Snaggy Point on the Red River, Louisiana; mustered out 8 July 1865 at Camp Chase, Ohio. [Also served in Co I 87th OH Inf.]

"List of Casualties...while on board the Steamer 'City Belle' near 'Snaggy Point' La, May 3d 1864...." Private J.R. HANNAH, missing, wounded. [From the records of the Ohio Adjutant General, available at the Ohio Historical Society, Columbus, Ohio. Contributed by Kerry Kimberly]

[Holmes Co Probate Court record: Robert HANNAH married Cristena HANNAH on 3 Feb 1831 in Holmes Co OH.]

1860 Census, Prairie Twp, Holmes Co OH, page 380: Robert HANNA, age 54 PA, carpenter; Jane, age 40 OH; Thomas, age 21 OH, day labor; James, age 19 OH, day labor; Ann E, age 16 OH; Nancy R, age 13 OH; Mary E, age 11 OH. 1870 Census, not found.

1880 Census, Lucas village, Richland Co OH, page 118: James R. HANNAH, age 39 OH, boarder, working on railroad, married. Living with John F. and Nancy R. McCORMICK and family. *Sister, Nancy*. [*FamilySearch*, "Ohio, County Marriages, 1789-1994." Ashland County, v. 4, p. 53: John F. McCORMICK and Nancy R. HANNAH were married 29 Dec 1870 by D.H. French. John F. McCormick signed the marriage affidavit with his mark. Notation contributed by Kerry Kimberly]

National Homes for Volunteer Soldiers, 1866-1938, Dayton, OH, 10319: James R. HANNAH: Enlisted 1 June 1862 in Co I 87th OH at Frederickburg, Wayne Co OH, discharged 2 Oct 1862 at Delaware, OH, for expiration of time. Enlisted 25 Feb 1864 in Co D 120 OH Reg. at Wooster, Wayne Co OH. Discharged 8 July 1865 at Camp Chase, OH, at close of war. Contracted diabetes mellitus at Camp Ford, TX. Born Hayesville, Holmes Co OH. Residence subsequent to discharge, Hayesville, OH. Carpenter. Single. Nearest Relative: William WILSON, Hayesville, OH. Admitted to Dayton on 1 Aug 1881. Died 21 May 1883, cause mollitus cerebri. [William Wilson was James Hanna's brother-in-law. Wilson married James' sister Isabelle in 1858. Contributed by Kerry Kimberly]

Another James HANNA:

In the Official Roster of the Soldiers of the State of Ohio in the War of the Rebellion, Vol. VIII: James HANNA enlisted in Company C, 114th OVI 22 Aug 1862 for 3 years and he mustered out with the company 31 July 1865. This would be the record for that James Hanna: Pension index: James Hanna, Co C 114th OH Inf. This soldier died 16 May 1911. Invalid pension 22 Oct 1884, Application 524991, Certificate 297071. Widow's pension, 7 June 1911, Application 966402, Certificate 727918.
