McCLAIN, James\* 15 Aug 1862 McLain [Try also, Macklin McClane]  
 Corporal McClain was age 38 when he entered service. He was appointed Corporal [date not given]; he died 23 May 1864 near Alexandria, Louisiana of wounds received on 3 May 1864 in action near Snaggy Point, on the Red River, Louisiana. The Roll of Honor says he is buried at Alexandria, Louisiana.

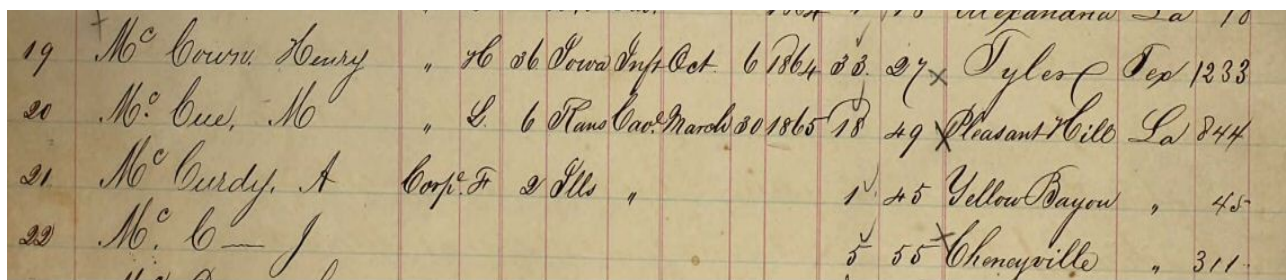

She says next to this is a stone inscribed as Louis JONES. But so far that JONES clue has not added any proof.

Registers of Deaths of Volunteers, 1861-1865: James McCLANE, Corporal, Co D 120th OH Inf, died 23 May at Regimental Hospital. Cause: gun shot wound. Regimental Surgeon, Byron Stanton. [I am wondering if some of these registrations came from reports given later to the Surgeon and which he recorded while in camp at other places. Other reports, for example Marcus M Spiegel, were done the same way. Spiegle was reported to have died at Wilson's Plantation in Louisiana in his pension papers and near Alexandria LA in the Ohio Roster, but his Register of Death record, also signed by Stanton, said he died at Kingston GA. Kingston GA is probably where Stanton was when he registered Spiegle's death, but Spiegle wasn't there. Sergt Joseph SEIBERT, Co C, actually was killed near Snaggy Point LA, but Stanton registered his death as happening near Kingston GA.] So, because some wounded from Snaggy Point were taken to Cheneyville for treatment, I believe that is where James McClain actually died. And those men were eventually buried at Alexandria.

Burial Registers, Military Posts and National Cemeteries, 1862-1960: J. McC is on a page with men who died in 1864 and 1865 and are buried in various places in LA and TX, some at Alexandria LA. J. McC was listed as originally buried at Cheneyville LA. No other information is there for him. The numbers in the last column are the number of disinterment, but also correspond to their burial plot in Alexandria National Cem. The numbers 5 and 55 are the Grave Mark Section and Number.
