PAINTER, David 15 Aug 1862

Private David Painter was age 22 when he entered service. He was transferred to Co. H, 114th OVI on 27 Nov 1864. Transferred to Co F, 48th OVI, 24 July 1865. Mustered out 14 Oct 1865. [Captured **probably** at Snaggy Point or later on the opposite shore. Paroled 17 Jun 1864 at Red River Landing, LA]

Exchange of Prisoners of War, Headquarters Department of the Gulf, New Orleans, August 4?, 1864, "General Orders No. 107. The following named Officers, Non-commissioned Officers, and privates, being of the number of prisoners of war delivered on parole at Red River Landing, La., June 17, 1864, and being an equivalent for one hundred and ten (110) privates, are hereby declared duly exchanged, in accordance with an agreement entered into July 22d, 1864, between Colonel Charles C. Dwight, United States

Commissioner of Exchange for the Military Division of the West Mississippi, and Major Jg. S*ymanski, Confederate States Commissioner of Exchange for the Trans-Mississippi Department : " included Peter ECKARD, Pvt, Co D 120th OH Volunteers; Jacob S. FISHER, Pvt, Co F 120th OH Volunteers; David PAINTER, Pvt, Co E 120th OH Volunteers "Officers and enlisted men above enumerated will join their respective commands without delay. By Command of Major Gen. BANKS. George B. Drake, A. A. General."

1850 Census, Chester Twp, Wayne Co OH, Dwelling 162, Family 163: John PAINTER, age 53 PA, farmer; Susanna, age 33 PA; William, age 29 PA, blacksmith; John, age 20 OH, farmer; Elizabeth, age 12 OH; David, age 10 OH; Samuel, age 8 OH; Daniel, age 6 OH.

Contributed by Sandy Rice [History of Montgomery Co., Kansas, page 818, Lew Wallace Duncan Co. Pub. 1903] The father John had been previously married to Susan Brenker and had six children with her: William, Jacob, Catherine, Susannah, Mary and John. See William and John in the 1850 census.

?1860 Census, Salt Creek Twp, Wayne County OH, page 178: David PAINTER, age 21 OH, was a student living with John and Elizabeth RODGERS.

1860 Census, Chester Twp, Wayne County OH, page 314: John PAINTER, age 63 PA, farmer; Susan, age 43 PA; John, age 27 OH; David, age 22 OH; Samuel, age 18 OH; Daniel, age 16 OH [see below]; Susannah RICE, age 30 OH; Mary Eliz RICE, age 8 OH.

Ohio, County Marriages: David PAINTER married Emeline D. MILLER, 26 Aug 1862, Wooster, Wayne Co OH.

Pub. 1903] "...David, who died of consumption in 1864, at the age of thirty-two, resulting from the exposures of army life in over-exerting himself in carrying the dead and wounded from a boat, wading in water up to his shoulders. David enlisted in Co. 'E,' 120th O. V. I., and served in the Trans-Mississippi army. On the Red River expedition, he took cold and, after a time in the hospital, came home to die..." Brother Jacob was a 49er.

1870 Census, Chester Twp, Wayne County, OH, page 66: David PAINTER, age 31 OH, school teacher; Emily, age 28 OH; Wallace, age 3 OH.

1880 Census, Lattasburg village, Chester Twp, Wayne County OH, page 62: Emaline PAINTER, age 38 OH, parents born PA; Wallace W, son, age 14 OH; Charles C, son, age 11 OH.

Not on 1890 Veterans Schedule.

[Note: Emaline, age 59 OH, born Feb 1841, a widow, is listed as mother of Wallace PAINTER, in the 1900 census. She is living with Wallace and his wife Hattie B, and their children Alice and Walter in Chester Twp, Wayne County OH.]

Ohio, Deaths, 1908-1953: Emeline M. PAINTER died 11 Sep 1924 ta Chester Twp, Wayne Co OH, at age 83. Widow. Born 20 Feb 1841 at Wooster, Wayne Co OH. Burial at Eight Square Cemetery. Father George D. MILLER, born PA. Mother Elizabeth MOWREY, born PA. Spouse: David PAINTER.
