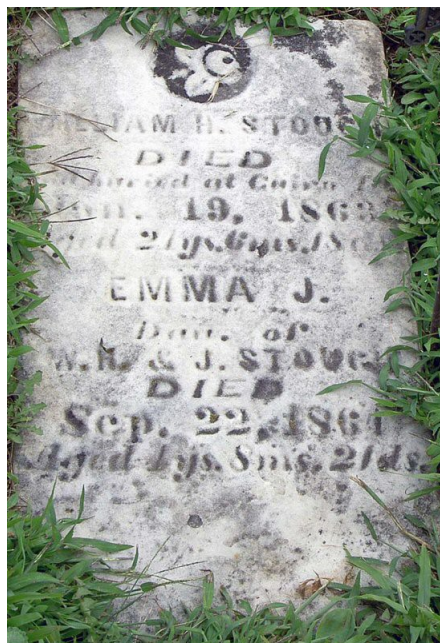


Company E, 120th Ohio Volunteer Infantry

STOUGHT, William H.* 14 Aug 1862 STOUGH

Private Stough was age 24 when he entered service. He died on 20 Jan 1863 on a hospital boat. The Roll of Honor lists him as being buried at Mound City, Illinois.

Father: George STOUGH

Mother: Ann TIEMMERLIN/KIMMERLIN/KEMBERLING[married 19 Sep 1824]

Death: 27 or 20 Jan 1863

Not found on Registers of Deaths of Volunteers, 1861-1865.

Burial Registers, Military Posts and National Cemeteries, 1862-1960: William H. SLOUGH, Private, Co E 120th OH Inf, died 27 January 1863. Mound City, section B 1629[old numbering system].

National Cemetery Interment Control Forms, 1928-1962: William H. SLOUGH, Pvt, Co E 120 OH Inf, died 27 Jan 1863. Mound City IL National Cemetery, grave 4824.

Listed at Department of Veterans Affairs: W. H. SLOUGH, Pvt, US Army, Civil War, died 27 Jan 1863, Mound City National Cemetery, IL. Section F site 4824.

Pension Index: William H. STOUGH, Co E 120 OH Inf. Widow Rebecca J. applied 20 Mar 1863, Application 15876, no certificate; Minor guardian B. EASON, 18 Aug 1864, Application 61417, Certificate 56235. Widow may have died or remarried.

1850 Census, Plain Twp, Wayne Co OH, Dwelling 251, Family 264: George STOUGH, age 56 PA, inn keeper; Anna, age 46 unknown; Daniel, age 14 OH; William H., age 13 OH; Thomas C, age 10 OH; Juliann WINNE?, age 10 OH. [Wayne Co Probate Court record: George STOUGH married Ann TIEMMERLIN, 19 Sep 1824 in Wayne Co OH. Another county record says Ann KIMMERLIN.]

1860 Census, Plain Twp, Wayne Co OH, Dwelling 281, Family 281: Anna STOUGH, age 55 OH, widow, grocer; William, age 21 OH, grocer; Rebecca Jane, age 19 OH; Thomas C, age 20 OH; Emma Jane, age 4 months OH.

Emma J. died 22 Sep 1864 and was buried at [Blachleyville Cem.](#), Wayne Co OH. So William must have had another child since there is a minor on the pension card.....Ida, born Dec 1861 according to the 1900 Census.

Did not find on 1890 Veterans Schedule.

daughter, Ohio Marriage record for Ida E. STOUGH, married Julius CHEYNEY, 20 Jul 1899, Wayne Co OH. Ida was born ca 1862 at Blachleysville, [Plain Twp, Wayne Co], OH. Her mother was Rebecca J. CHUBB; father STOUGH. [Ida Cheyney's death record does not give her parents' names. She is buried at Crown Hill Cemetery in Orrville OH]

brother: Thomas C. STOUGH died 5 Nov 1817 at State Soldiers' Home, Perkins, Erie Co OH, age 77y 6m 18d, widowed. Born 18 Apr 1840 in OH. Burial at Mansfield, OH. Blacksmith. Father Geo. STOUGH, born PA. Mother Annie KEMBERLING, born PA.

Pension papers at fold3.com:

Emma J. STOUGH and Ida E. STOUGH were the minor children of William H. STOUGH, Pvt, Co E 120th OH Vols. Guardian resided at Wayne Co OH, post office Wooster. William STOUGH died 20 Jan 1863 of typhoid fever. His marriage was in PA. Emma J. born 9 Feb 1860. Ada E, born 9 Dec 1861. Widow remarried 15 Oct 1863.

Three documents say Emma J, died 27 Sep 1865. Stone at Blachleyville Cem, Wayne Co OH, says she died 22 Sep 1864, age 4 yrs, 8 m, 21 dys.

Benjamin Eason was guardian. Said William STOUGH died on board U. S. Steamer "Divernan"....hard to read.... near Cairo, IL., of typhoid fever. The widow remarried William CORNELIUS on 15 Oct 1863. William STOUGH and Rebecca were married at Beaver Co PA on 7 June 1858 by Robert Graham, JP.

Assistant Adjutant General's report said that William STOUGH died on the Mississippi River 20 Jan 1863 on steamboat "Die Vemen" on the Mississippi River near Cairo [IL].

Benjamin Eason's affidavit says that STOUGH was on the Government Steamer "Key West No. 2" on the Mississippi River between Memphis and Vicksburg in Dec 1862 when he got sick with typhoid fever from unavoidable exposure incident to military and Camp Life. He died 20 Jan 1863 on the Government Steamer "Die Vernon" "on the Mississippi River a short distance below the mouth of the Ohio, that the body was left and buried at Cairo Ill..."

In another document Eason said:

"that he [STOUGH] went down the Mississippi River with the Regiment, that he took sick in the service sometime before the Battle of Chickasaw Bluffs near Vicksburg, that after the Battle he returned with the Regiment to the mouth of White River, just before the Battle of Arkansas Post, that he was transferred from the Steamer upon which the Company was to the Steamer DieVernon and sent up the River with other sick from the Army, that he died on board said Steamer Die Vernon, shortly before it reached Cairo, on the 20th day of January 1863, that his remains were put on shore at Cairo and there buried....."

Marriage: 7 June 1858, Justice of the Peace Robert Graham at Beaver Co PA married William STOUGH of Plain Twp, Wayne Co OH and Rebecca J. CHUBB.

Remarriage of the widow: Rebecca Jane STOUGH married William CORNELIUS on 15 Oct 1863 by Henry LEHMAN, J. P.

Dr. William BLACHLY was in attendance at the birth of Emma J. STOUGH, 9 Feb 1860 and Ida E. STOUGH, 9 Dec 1861.
