Private Weltmer was age 30 when he entered service. He was captured 3 May 1864 near Snaggy Point on the Red River, Louisiana; mustered out 7 July 1865 at Camp Chase, Ohio.

Wooster Weekly Republican, Wednesday, 6 Feb 1895, page 3 [died 2 Feb 1895]
Another veteran of the Rebellion, John H. Weltmer, of Plain township, crossed the picket line to the shores of peace eternal on Saturday evening. Mr. Weltmer for some months has been suffering from a general breaking down of his constitution. He has been making his home with his niece, Mrs. B.B. Speiker, Stibbs street, Wooster, where he died Saturday night, Feb. 2. John H. Weltmer was born in Wooster township 63 years ago, and spent nearly all his life in Wayne county. When his country called for volunteers to put down the rebellion he enlisted August 13, 1862, in Co. E 120th Regt. O.V.I., serving until discharged July 13, 1865. He was a member of Given Post Grand Army of the Republic. Three children, Mrs. Charles Keets [Ohio, County Marriage record: Charles W. KEETS married Jennie WELTMER, 21 Sep 1893, Wayne Co OH], Plain

township, Hovey O. Weltmer, Neponset, Ill, and Miss Arvilla Weltmer, Greenville, Ill., survive him. The funeral took place Monday morning. Brief services were held at the house at 10 a.m., after which the remains were taken to the Plain Church, five miles west of Wooster, where exercises were held, when the casket was lowered into a grave in the graveyard at the church.

John H. Weltmer of Plain township, died on Saturday, Feb. 2, at the home of his niece, Mrs. B. B. Speiker of Stibbs street, Wooster. Mr. Weltmer was born in Clinton township in 1832 and was engaged in farming in Wayne county during the greater part of his life. Interment at Plain church on last Monday. Mr. Weltmer spent three years in the service of his country during the War of the Rebellion, serving in the 120th Reg't. O.V.I. and was a member of Given Post G.A.R. Three children survive him, Miss Amelia Weltmer of Greenville, Ill., Mrs. Chas. Keets, Plain township and Hower Weltmer, Nesponsett, Ill.

Daughter Jennie [Ida V.] WELTMER KEETS had child Gail Irene KEETS on 19 Sep 1895 at Plain Twp, Wayne Co OH. Child's father: C. H. KEETS.

In the 1900 Census Neponset Twp, Bureau Co IL, page 146, Hovey WELTMORE is living as a servant with the William and Martha STABLER family. He is age 26, single, born Sep? 1873 in Indiana, parents born IN. So I don't know if this is the right person for the son of this soldier or if the birth information is not correct.

1910 Census, Kewanee city Ward 2, Henry Co IL, 700 Water St, Dwelling 75, Family 75: Hovey WELTNER, age 36 OH, first marriage, married one yr, parents born OH, laborer in steel mill; Maggie, wife, age 29 IL, first marriage, married one yr, father born Sweden, mother born OH, no occupation.

John's brother Joseph? Ohio Death Records: Joseph Derman WELTMER died 7 Apr 1921 at Wooster Twp, Wayne Co OH. Born 4 Oct 1835. Father Felix WELTMER, born PA. Mother HOWER born PA. Spouse: Sarah. Burial Mohican.
