BUCK, Henry 21 Aug 1862

Captain Buck was age 45 when he entered service. He resigned 15 Feb 1863.

Marriage: 1Hannah GRANT on 26 Nov 1835, Stark Co OH

Pension Index: Henry BUCK, F 120th OH Inf. Invalid 1882 Oct 30, Application 463595, Certificate 821956, filed in MO.

Widow Rebecca Buck applied for pension 14 Nov 1907, Application 879651, Certificate 646706, filed in Missouri.

1st marriage, Stark County OH probate court record: Henry BUCK married Hannah GRANT on 26 Nov 1835. [BUCK researchers say this was Henry's first marriage.] They had three children: Sarah Elizabeth, Robert Nelson and Mary Ann.

2nd marriage, Ashland County Ohio marriages: Henry BUCK married Rebecca WEBSTER on 2 May 1850.

1870 Census, Alliance Pct, Stark Co OH, Dwelling 94, Family 98: Rebecca BUCK, age 41 OH; Melvina, age 18 OH; John W, age 16 OH, roll mill worker; Charles W, age 14 OH; Wm H, age 12 OH; Emanuel K, age 9 OH; Malinda, age 7 OH; Carrie A, age 4 OH; Viola, age one OH; Ezra J. HUFFMAN, age 25 OH, conductor R.R.; Joseph BUSGROW, age 24 OH, brakesman R.R.

Sketch below mentioned that they moved from Salem OH to Morgan Co MO in 1875; and that Emanuel was born in Towsburg, OH, 6 Sep 1860. [Note: Could that have been Twinsburg in Summit County OH?]

1880 Census, Osage Twp, Morgan County, MO, page 261: Henry BUCK, age 64 PA, farmer and physician, parents born PA; Rebecca, wife, age 52 OH, father born PA, mother born OH; Melvina, daughter, age 28 OH; William, son, age 22, OH, teaching school; Emanuel, son, age 20 OH; Malinda, daughter, age 17 OH; Carry A., daughter, age 14 OH; Viola, daughter, age 11 OH.

1890 Veterans Schedule: Moreau Twp, Morgan Co MO: Line 17, House 120, Family 122: Henry BUCK, Captain, Co F 120 OVI. Post Office: Versailles, MO. Disabilities: heart disease, blood poison and hemorrhoids.

1900 Census, Versailles, Marian Twp, Morgan County, MO, page 85: Henry BUCK, age 84 PA, born Feb 1816, physician, married 50 yrs, parents born PA; Rebecca, wife, age 71 OH, born Dec 1828, married 50 yrs, 8 children/7 still living, parents born PA; Mellie, daughter, age 48 OH, born Dec 1851, single, dress making at home.

"Henry Buck Dead.

Henry Buck was born in Juniata county, Pa., Feb. 8, 1816, and died at his home in Versailles, Mo., October 11th, 1907 at 3:30 p. M. aged 91 years 8 months and 3 days.

Mr. Buck moved from Pennsylvania to Ohio, and at the age of 27 he began the practice of medicine, and followed that profession for forty-five years. He joined the Methodist church when seventeen years old, and lived a faithful member until his death. He was licensed to preach about forty years ago, and he regretted very much during his last days that he had not devoted his entire time to preaching the gospel.

He organized Company F, 120th Ohio volunteer Inf., and served as its Captain during the civil war, serving his country faithfully in its great need.

He moved from Ohio in 1875, locating 8 1-2 miles southeast of Versailles, Morgan county, on what is known as the old Buck farm. He continued the practice of medicine for about ten years after coming to Missouri. In August, 1899, he left the farm and moved to Versailles, making this city his home until the call

came.

He was the father of twelve children, three by his first wife and nine by his present wife, eight of whom are still living. They are Mrs. Mary Keller and Cary B. Knoll, of Alliance, Ohio, Mrs. Lynn Buck, of Lebanon, Mo., Mrs. Viola B. Gilson, Emanuel K. Buck, and Miss Nellie Buck, of Versailles; Prof. W. H. Buck, of Magnolia, Arkansas, and John W. Buck, of Los Angeles, California.

The funeral services were held at the M. E. church, Sunday afternoon, conducted by the pastor, Rev. C. Bewely, after which the remains were conveyed to the city cemetery, followed by a large concourse of sympathizing friends and neighbors, and laid to rest to await that great day, when we shall all meet again.

He was a faithful and devoted husband, a loving father, a good citizen and devout christian, and his works do follow him. The aged wife and children have the sympathy of a host of friends in their sad bereavement."

"Dr. Henry Buck, an old physician of Versailles, died October 11, 1907." [Note: He is buried in Versailles Cemetery.]

"Dr. Henry Buck, the father of this sketch [Sketch about son Emanuel K.], was born in Millerstown, Pa., Feb. 8, 1915. His wife, Rebecca Buck, was born in Ashland county, Ohio, December 30, 1828. E. K. Buck came with his father's family from Salem, Ohio, to Morgan county in 1875. Emanuel's brothers and sisters are as follows: Mellie, age 56, John W., age 54; Charles W., age 51; W. H., age 49; George, age 45; Valinda E., age 44; Carrie, age 42; Viola M., age 38. The father of this sketch has been a physician all of his life. In politics he has always been a leading, thinking Republican..."
