JACKSON, William J. 25 Feb 1864  
Private Jackson was age 32 when he entered service. He was transferred to Co. E 114th OVI on 27 Nov 1864. [also, B 48th, G 13th Iowa Infantry]

Wife 1880 Census, Adams Twp, Dallas Co, IA, Dwelling and Family numbers are not readable, page stamped 344 A; looked on Heritage Quest copy and it looks like Dwelling 505, Family 519: Sarah JACKSON, age 32 MO married, father born VA, mother born MO; Ella, daughter, age 5 IA, father born PA, mother born MO; Anna, daughter, age 5 IA, father born PA, mother born MO; Eva, daughter, age 2 IA, father born PA, mother born MO; Spicer WIZE or MIZE, age 15 Idaho Terr, nephew, parents born MO.

George W. and Martha Jackson were also living Arkansas River, Fremont, Colorado.

Died

At the residence of his brother, G. W. Jackson, near Canon City, Colo., on Monday Oct. 7, 1895, at 10:30 a. m., of paralysis, William J. Jackson, aged about 63 years. The deceased was born at Lancaster, Pa, Aug. 25, 1832, and came to Colorado in 1880 and remained with his brother, who then resided at Howard, Colo., for nearly four years. He next moved to Salida and thence to Delta. He came to Canon city to visit his brother during the Fruit Day festivities and while here was stricken down with paralysis which baffled medical skill.

William J. Jackson was a soldier of the late war, having enlisted first in the 13th Iowa Infantry. He was severely wounded in the battle of Shiloh and was discharged from the service. Regaining his health he re-

inlisted[sic], entering service in the 120<sup>th</sup> Ohio Infantry and served therein until the close of the war with honor to himself. The funeral services will be held from the M. E. church, tomorrow afternoon at 2 o'clock. – Canon City Clipper. [William was in Co F as a private. Finished the war in the 48<sup>th</sup> OH]
