

## Company G, 120<sup>th</sup> Ohio Volunteer Infantry

BOAK, James T.\* 30 Sept 1862 Alternate name James BOAK

James, age 18, is listed in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers 1861-66 volume 8, page 261 as a private. He died 3 Sep 1863 in hospital at New Orleans, LA. The Roll of Honor in the back of the Roster book lists James T. Boak as being buried at Chalmette, Louisiana.

US Registers of Deaths of Volunteers, 1861 - 1865: Have not found.

1850 Census, Chippewa Twp, Wayne Co OH, dwelling 310, family 325: George STICKLER, age 50 PA, farmer; Magdalene, age 45 PA; Elias, age 13 OH; Sabilla, age 12 OH; Lovina, age 10 OH; Martha M, age 6 OH; James BOKE, age 5 OH. [Ohio Marriages: George STICKLER married Magdalena ROW, 25 May 1823, Stark Co OH. So Magdalena's name was not BOKE/BOAK. I wonder if James was related to this Stickler family in some other way.]

1860 census, Chippewa Twp, Wayne Co OH page 373.

James T. Boak, age 15, born in OH, is living with George Stickler (59 PA), Magdeleina (55 PA), and Martha M. (16 OH).

Wooster Republican, 1 Jan 1863: Listed James Boak's residence as Chippewa.
