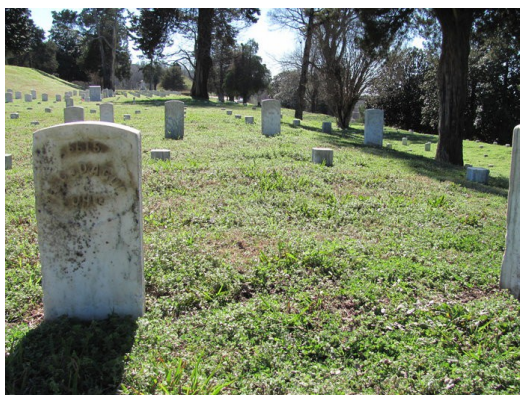

DAGUE, Cyrus C.* 23 Aug 1862
Cyrus Coe DAGUE
Cyrus, age 20, is listed in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers 1861-66 volume 8, page 261 as a private. Cyrus died 5 Aug 1863 at Vicksburg, Mississippi.

The Roll of Honor in the back of the Roster book lists Cyrus C. Dague as being buried at Vicksburg, Miss in section L, grave 570. [old numbering system for the cemetery]

C.C. Dague, died 5 Aug 1863, Pvt., Civil War, Co. G 120th OVI Information at [Find a Grave](#): Cyrus Coe DAGUE, born 1 May 1839 PA.

Registers of Deaths of Volunteers, 1861-1865: Cyrus DAGUE, Private, Co G 120th OH Inf, died 5 Aug 1863 at Regimental Hospital. Cause: typho mal fever.

Burial Registers, Military Posts and National Cemeteries, 1862-1960: running number 2513, Cyrus C DAGUE, Private, Co G 120th OVI, died 5 Aug 1863. Vicksburg old number L 570.

20 March 1868 on sheet: Original burial: "One mile south of the southern boundary line of the corporation of Vicksburg. Commencing at the point where the Warrenton Road (which is know as Washington street as it passes through Vicksburg) crosses the Vicksburg and Meridian Rail Road on the place known as Readings home place and one half mile south west of his (Mr. Readings) residence at the foot of the bluff in the bottom in rows of graves running north and south heads of the bodies towards the west."

National Cemetery Interment Control Forms, 1928-1962: C. C. DAGUE [Codugue], Pvt, Co G 120 OH Inf. Died 5 Aug 1863. For original burial see William Edwards. Dague's burial at Vicksburg Sec L, Grave 6615. [William Edwards was Pvt Co G 87th IL, no death date given. Originally buried on Gibb's land on Warrenton Road, 2.5 miles south of Vicksburg. Vicksburg burial Sec L Grave 6614.]

Not found on Pension Index.

Parents and siblings of Cyrus: [Commemorative Biographical Record of Wayne County Ohio](#) page 189-99

Gabriel Dague [wife Rachel Howe...[History of Medina County and Ohio 1881](#) by Baskin and Battey page 708] came to Milton Township, Wayne co Ohio in 1820. He resided there until 1843 when he moved to Chippewa Township and then in 1849 he moved to Wadsworth which is located in Medina county. His children were Archibald, Michael, Joseph, Elizabeth, Gabriel, Andrew Hiram, Ephraim, Samuel and Cyrus. It states that Cyrus "died in the service of the United States, at Vicksburg, Miss. during the War of the Rebellion."

So was Cyrus a cousin of Gabriel and Thomas J. of this Company G?

1850 Census, Wadsworth, Medina, OH, Dwelling 14, Family 15: Gabriel DAGUE, age 60 PA, FARMER; Rachel, age 55 PA; Hiram, age 20 PA, laborer; Ephraim, age 18 PA, laborer; Samuel, age 15 PA, laborer; Cyrus, age 11 PA.

1860 Census, Series M653 Roll 1007, Wadsworth Twp, Medina Co OH, page 11: Gabriel DAGE, age 69 PA, farmer; Rachael, wife, age 64 PA; Ephraim, age 26 OH, farm hand; Gabriel L. age 31 OH, sadler. [Note: So where is Cyrus?]

Wooster Republican, 1 Jan 1863: Listed Cyrus C. Dague's residence as Western Star. [Western Star is in Summit County OH, east of Wadsworth where S. Medina Line Rd meets Broad St/Greenwich Rd. west of rt 21 and south of rt 224.
