

## Company G, 120<sup>th</sup> Ohio Volunteer Infantry

KISSINGER, Franklin 22 Aug 1862  
Franklin, age 21, is listed in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers 1861-66 volume 8, page 262 as a private.  
He was captured 3 May 1864 near Snaggy Point on the Red River in Louisiana. He mustered out 7 July 1865 at Camp Chase OH by order of the War Department.

Franklin Kissinger of Co G 120th was discharged 7 July 1865 from Camp Chase. It says he was born in Lancaster County PA. It says he was 22 when he enlisted and was 5' 9½" tall, medium complexion, dark blue eyes, and brown hair. He was a farmer when he enlisted. The Oath of Identity was not filled out.

Franklin H. Kissinger was two years, ten months and twenty-one days a soldier. He enlisted at Doylestown, Aug 16, 1862, and at Camp Mansfield, October 14th, was mustered into Company G, 120th Ohio Volunteer Infantry. The regiment reported to Memphis in time to take part in Sherman's expedition down the Mississippi, and was assigned to the 1st brigade, 2nd division, 13th army corps. In this corps it took part in the battles under Grant, of the Vicksburg campaign, and Mr. Kissinger was a participant in the battles of Chickasaw Bayou, Arkansas Post, Thompsons Hill, the assaults on Vicksburg and the battle of Jackson. At Thompsons Hill he had his suspenders shot in two, but he was never wounded. He was one of the unfortunates captured at Snaggy Point, and saw 13 months of imprisonment in Camp Ford. All the horrors that are elsewhere portrayed in this work as having been perpetrated, he saw: men beaten over the head with revolvers, tied up by their thumbs, was himself kept without rations for three days; rations were a pint of corn meal a day, a spoonful of salt a week, and the sufferings such as no tongue can portray. Mr. Kissinger was paroled in the spring of 1865, and was discharged from the service at Camp Chase, July 7, 1865. He is a member of Jeremiah Galehouse Post, N. 297, G.A.R. He was born in Lancaster county, Pennsylvania, son of Peter and Elizabeth (Harner) Kissinger. He married, in Easton, Wayne county, a daughter of Samuel and Jane (Lee) Trimby, Mary C., born in Medina county, Ohio. Their firstborn, William

Henry, was born December 23, 1869, and died when a week old. They have three living children: Clara J., born March 22, 1871; David H., May 14, 1875; Charles F. January 7, 1879. Mr. Kissinger is a farmer, of Chippewa township. Postoffice address, Easton, Wayne county.

Civil War Veteran Passes Away

Frank Kissinger, 84, died at the home in Easton. Tuesday morning. Cause of death, dropsy.

He was a Civil war veteran and was imprisoned in Libby Prison for 13 months and when released he weighed less than 100 pounds. There are but few of the Civil war veterans remaining.

[Libby Prison was way over in Richmond Virginia. The men of the 120th who were captured at Snaggy Point in Louisiana were imprisoned at Camp Ford near Tyler TX. Please see the history section.]

[Easton is in Chippewa Twp. near Doylestown, Wayne co OH.]
