FARMER, Joseph

Joseph, age 27, is listed in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers 1861-66 volume 8, page 264 as Private. He was **captured** 3 May 1864 near Snaggy Point, on Red River LA; mustered out 6 July 1865 at Camp Chase OH.

Father: William FARMER, born PA

Mother: Jane HOUGH, born PA

Birth: <1832/1835>

Marriage: Single

Death: 28 Mar 1918 at Sedro Woolley, WA

Cemetery: Union Cemetery, Sedro-Woolley, Skagit Co WA. [Info at Find a Grave but there is [no tombstone](#).

Relationship: Brother of Jacob FARMER of Co H, 120th OVI

Pension Index: Joseph FARMER, G 114th and H 120th OH Inf. Joseph applied for an invalid's pension in 1889 July 1 in Minnesota, Application 714308, Certificate 1094334 . Pension Card: Joseph died 28 Mar 1918 at Sedro Woolley, WA.

[Note: Veterans Administration Pension Payment Cards, 1907-1933 says he died 28 Mar 1918 at Burlington, Washington, R. D #2]

1850 Census Green Twp Wayne Co OH, Dwelling 267, Family 273: William (50 PA), occupation farming, (listed as James in the 1860 census); Jane (44 PA) FARMER; David (21 OH), carpenter, William (18 OH), Mary (16 OH), Joseph (15 OH); Nancy (14 OH), Sarah (12 OH), Jacob (11 OH) Eliza (10 OH), Isaac (6 OH), and Elizabeth(4 OH). [Joseph and Jacob's mother was Jane Hough.]

1860 Census, can't find Joseph.

1870 Census, Series: T132 Roll 10, Baldwin Twp, Sherburne Co, MN, page 540: Joseph FARMER, age 33 OH, farmer. Nobody else listed with him.

A Joseph Farmer was a patentee for land in Sherburne County Minnesota. The patent was issued 15 Ap 1873. You can find this at the GLO site: <http://www.glorerecords.blm.gov/>

1880 Census, have not found.

1885, Minnesota, Territorial and State Censuses, 1849-1905: Holding, Stearns Co MN, page 9, 1885: Joseph FARMER, age 49, born OH. He is living with family 61, the Anton and Barbara HONHOFF family.

1900 Census, Clear Lake, Skagit Co WA, Dwelling 74, Family 74: Joseph FRAMER, age 66 OH, single, born May 1834, parents born PA, general laborer.

1910 Census, Stirling Road, Sedro Woolley, Skagit Co WA, Dwelling 256, Family 267: Joseph FARMER, age 74 OH, single, father born PA, mother born England, farmer on own farm. Not marked as a veteran.

Washington Death Certificates: Joseph FARMER died 23 Mar 1918, Sedro-Woolley, Skagit Co WA; age 78, born <1840>.
