HUNTER, William [Missing] 21 Aug 1862

William, age 21, is listed in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers 1861-66 volume 8, page 264, as a Private.

There are no comments listed in the Roster for William.

Hardesty's Wayne county Roll of Honor says that William enlisted at Apple Creek. It also states that he was reported missing.

1860 Census, East Union Twp, Wayne Co OH, page 25: Wilson HUNTER, age 44 OH, farmer; Mary, age 42 OH; David, age 20 OH; William, age 19 OH; Samuel, age 17 OH; Alexander, age 15 OH; James, age 13 OH; Thomas, age 11 OH; Franklin, age 5 OH; Wilson, age 2 OH; Sarah E., age 8 OH.

Hardesty's [Wayne County version] page 492: Another son this patriot couple gave to the service, and of his fate they still remain ignorant. He served in the same company with his brother, until on the Red River campaign he was sent on a foraging expedition from which he never returned. Whether he fell by the hand of the lurking bushwhacker, or wasted away with sickness and died among strangers, is unknown. His name was William Hunter.
