STAKE, Andrew J. 1 Sept 1862 Andrew, age 25, is listed in the Roster of Ohio Soldiers 1861-66 volume 8, page 265, as a Private. He was **captured** 3 May 1864 near Snaggy Point on the Red River, LA; he mustered out 6 July 1865 at Camp Chase, OH.

Mother: Caroline HOLMAN, Franklin Co PA

Birth: <1837>OH

Marriage: Christena GRANER 15 Jun 1856

Death: 4 Nov 1870

Cemetery: Bellville Cemetery, Jefferson Twp., Richland County, OH: Cemetery book for Richland County says he died 4 Nov 1871, age 34 years 4 months.

[Stone is hard to read.] There is no flag holder for Andrew.

Relationship: Brother of George W. STAKE, Co H 120th OVI

Pension Index: Andrew J STAKE, H 120th OH Inf. Invalid filed 1867 Sep 2, Application 128390, Certificate 87588. Minor, G [S] BELL guardian, filed 1872 Oct 26, Application 206023, Certificate 168266.

A Centennial Biographical History of Richland County Ohio, by A. J. Baughman, 1901, pp 444 - 446: Mother's name spelled HALLMAN. Parents born Franklin Co PA. Seven children in the family. Family came to Richland County in 1834. Father died age 36. Andrew and four of his brothers joined the Union army. Andrew J. and George W., Co H 120th OH Inf.; Perry, 4th MO Cavalry "his clothing was eight times pierced by rebel bullets."; Daniel, 64th OH Inf., killed at Stone river; John, 4th MO Cavalry. George W. born 25 Sep 1838 at Monroe Twp, Richland Co. As a young boy, George worked as a farm hand and in a woolen mill in Newville.

[Note: There is a Peter STAKE buried at Malabar Farm State Park, Lucas Twp, Richland Co OH. Died 11 Jun 1831, age 39 yrs, 2 months, 0 dys. [Find a Grave](#)

Brother George: From [Hardesty's](#) for Richland County OH:

"George W. Stake was born in Monroe township, Richland county, Ohio, September 25, 1838, a son of Peter and Caroline (Holman) Stake."

From [Hardesty's](#) for Richland County OH: "Andrew Jackson Stake entered the same company with his brother George W. [*See George Stake's file.*] He was taken prisoner on the Red River expedition and held at Camp Ford, Texas, for thirteen months.....His death in November, 1870, resulted from the hardships he endured while in prison."

1870 Census haven't found

1880 Census, Village of Bellville, Richland Co OH, page 80: Christina STAKE, age 41 PA, widow, father born Germany, mother born MD; Clara M., daughter, age 22 OH, single, father born OH, mother born PA; John, son, age 19 OH, laborer, single, father born OH, mother born PA.
