

Company I, 120th Ohio Volunteer Infantry

BUISCHLEN, Christian 2 Sept 1862 Try Bushnell, Bushnel

Private Buischlen was age 29 when he entered service. Transferred to 13th Co., 2d Battalion, Veteran Reserve Corps, 1 Sept 1863; discharged 13 Apr 1865 at St. Louis, Missouri on a Surgeon's certificate of disability.

Cemetery: Not listed in Mansfield Cemetery.

Pension Index: Christian BUISCHLEN did apply for an invalid pension 21 Dec 1865, application 98,451. No certificate was registered, so he may have died shortly after the application was made.

Can not find in 1850.

Wooster Republican 28 May 1863: Casualties in the 120th Ohio: Christian Buishlen, flesh wound in thigh.

1860 Census there is a Christian BUSHNEL age 26 born PA, a farmhand....living in Springfield Township, Richland County OH with Haxton? and Martha BARRON?.

[Pension record] The soldier was a resident of Springfield Twp, Richland Co OH after the war.

Pension information in papers from Debbie Ferdetta:

"The applicant was wounded at Chickasaw Bluffs, Miss. by a musket ball....."

He was transferred to the reserve corps by reason of wound received in battle. Shot with a musket ball.

The soldier was discharged because of Chronic bronchitis and nephritis that were a result of a severe cold.

The soldier received treatment at Marine Hospital, ST. Louis, MO.

The soldier was born in Columbia Co PA. He was five feet, three inches tall, light complexion, blue eyes.

Listed as a farmer.

He was unable to work when he applied for a pension.

The soldier died leaving no heirs.

The soldier was a resident of Springfield Twp, Richland Co OH after the war.
