MAXWELL, James J.* 11 Aug 1862

Private Maxwell was age 20 when he entered service. Died 18 June 1863.

The Roll of Honor lists him as being buried at St. Louis, Missouri, in Jefferson Barracks Cemetery in section 5, grave 44.

1860 Census, Springfield Township, Richland County OH, Dwelling 1326, Family 1336: Wm MAXWELL age 52 PA, a farmer; Elizbth age 42 PA; James age 18 PA, farm hand; Alfred age 14 PA; Jane age 12 PA; Mary Age 9 PA; Wm age 7 OH; Giles age 5 OH; John age 1 OH.
